He was elected to the Caldwell City Council in 1989, where he served as Council President and on the Finance Committee, Traffic Commission, and Senior Citizen Board, Airport Commission and the Planning and Zoning liaison.

In July 1997 Garret Nancolas ran for Mayor of Caldwell on a platform of teamwork, cooperation, community pride and vision to move this great City forward.

He served as Mayor of Caldwell for twenty-three-years, 1998-2021.
