Our Successes:

Through the Boise RiverSweep we have:

- Increased awareness of the river litter problem through the formation of the *RiverSweep* cleanup committee and the annual fall clean-up;
- Provided leadership to bring together groups of citizens—from local governments, county and state agencies, recreational boaters, and environmental groups—to make this an annual event;
- Drawn attention to the litter problem in over a dozen newspaper articles and television interviews;
- Recruited students of every age to help with the *RiverSweep* by speaking to them in the local schools;
- Organized several hundred people to share in the recycling of hundreds of pounds of aluminum and plastic during the annual *RiverSweep*;
- Removed dump truck loads of glass and other trash to increase the cleanliness of the river banks and paths, and improve the safety for people, pets, and wildlife.
- Heightened community awareness of the magnitude of the littering problem, especially littering that is done by those who float the river;
- Improved habitat quality for numerous wildlife species;
- Increased the visual quality of the river; and most importantly,
- Provided a means for Treasure Valley citizens to show pride in their community by getting together to enhance, protect, and honor the beautiful river that flows through our city.

Boise Watershed Weekend Coordination




